2025

Golden Aspen leaves cover the slopes of our majestic Rocky Mountains as the dust from another Leadville Trail 100 mile race settles back onto those tortuous trails.

Never in the history of the Leadville Trail 100 have both race records been broken in the same year. The 2025 Leadville Trail 100 was momentous in that regard.

Jim Butera, legendary LT100 race founder, was probably dancing in the clouds above the finish line watching David Roche and Anne Flower become champions and course record holders in 2025.

The previous women's course record set in 1994 by world champion Ann Trason (18:06:24) was shattered by Anne Flower. Anne became the first woman to run under 18 hours in race history clocking a truly amazing time of 17:58:19 AND placing second overall in the race.

And then there was David Roche – breaking his own course record (15:26:34) set in 2024 and finishing with an astounding time of 15:12:30.

Only three men have run under 15 hours at Leadville: Matt Carpenter (15:42:59/2005), Rob Krar (15:51:57/2018) and Adrian Macdonald (15:56:34/2024).

Compare these 2025 winning times to the very first course records in 1983 and 1984, respectively for men and women:

- Skip Hamilton 20:11:18
- Teri Gerber 28:17:41

Oh how far we have come at Leadville...

Familiarity with the trail builds confidence along with new training methodology, course changes and better trail maintenance that led to improved racing times.

Then there are nutrition advances, fortunate weather conditions, lighter and advanced equipment developments and most of all, a strong community running spirit and comradery that push human limits at the Leadville Trail 100.

Remember, in the first edition of the Leadville Trail 100 way back in 1983 even the medical profession had doubts it was possible to run 100 miles at Leadville's stratospheric altitude let alone not killing someone in those mountains.

It is fascinating to watch the pendulum swing bringing true joy among those running those lofty trails along with a lot of blood, sweat and even tears.

Race Recap – It's pretty simple this year: David Roche from Boulder, Colorado and Anne Flower from Colorado Springs, Colorado dominated their races.

David ran in the lead from the first aid station at May Queen to the finishing line in downtown Leadville. It was as simple as that at least for spectators.

David Roche was the Leadville champion in 2024 where he set the men's course record, finally eclipsing the race record set by Matt Carpenter back in 2005. Coming back to the race in 2025, David had his eyes set on breaking his own course record.

On the women's side Katherine Asmuth, from California ran ahead of Anne Flowers through Outward Bound aid station (Outbound) but that was the extent of anyone running in front of Anne through the remainder of the race.

Katherine eventually dropped out of the race at Outward Bound (Inbound in 15:41:39) while running as 4th place woman at that stage of the race.

The 2025 Leadville Trail 100 women's Champion, Anne Flowers, is an emergency room doctor running her first 100-mile race. Before this 100-mile race, Anne won numerous trail races including marathons, 50K's, 50-miles and 100K races.

In Anne's words about being the first woman Leadville runner under 18 hours and beating Ann Trason's 1994 course record, "I feel like I shouldn't be in the same category as Ann Trason. She's a goddess of running."⁷

For the men, Justin Grunewald ran a strong race finishing in third place overall with a time of 18:06:34. Justin was passed by Anne in the home stretch after May Queen (Inbound) finishing 5 minutes behind Anne at 6th and Harrison in downtown Leadville.

Fourth place overall went to Patrick Cade in a time of 18:25:23 followed by Luke Phillips in 18:44:09 and 5th overall. Alexander Pawlak was fifth male with a time of 19:20:28 and sixth overall.

Imogen Ainsworth was the second-place woman with a time of 19:36:42 and 7th overall. Third place woman was Lea Mulligan in a time of 20:39:04 and 9th overall followed by fourth place woman

Genevieve Harrison in 20:57:23 and 10th overall. Fifth place woman was Rachel Downey with a time of 21:54:36 and 14th overall.

Weather conditions for this year's Leadville Trail 100 were spectacular and as perfect as can be for running in Colorado's high country.

There was another milestone at the race this year: Eric Pence finished his 30th Leadville Trail 100 Mile Running race with a time of 29:53:11 at age 59.

Eric became only the second person to achieve this remarkable journey. Bill Finkbeiner was the first runner to finish 30 races in 2013. Please see Eric's report about becoming a 30-time Leadville finisher posted below.

Let's see how the eight "favorites", as defined by Leadville Race Series Management, fared during the race.

Women:

Anne Flower – 2025 Champion in a new course record

Anna Curtis – Finisher 24:52:19; 19th female, 91st overall, 8th in F30-39 age group

Lea Mulligan – Finisher 20:39:04; 3rd female, 9th overall, 1st F20-29 age group

Jane Maus – Did not start (DNS)

Kat Edwards Anderson – Did not finish (DNF) at Winfield in 11:41:37

Lou Clifton – Finisher 23:12:08; 9th female, 30th overall, 1st F50-59th age group

Men:

David Roche – 2025 Champion in a new course record

JP Giblin – Did not start (DNS)

Corey Kallembach – Did not start (DNS)

Justin Grunewald – Finisher 18:06:34; 2nd male, 3rd overall, 2nd M30-39 age group

Cameron Hanes – Finisher 24:04:34; 42nd male, 57th overall, 3rd M50-59 age group

Brian Reynolds – Did not finish (DNF) at Twin Lakes (Inbound)

Reid Burrows – Did not finish (DNF) at Half Pipe (Inbound)

Art Hurtado – Finisher 22:30:23; 15th male, 20th overall, 7th in M40-49 age group

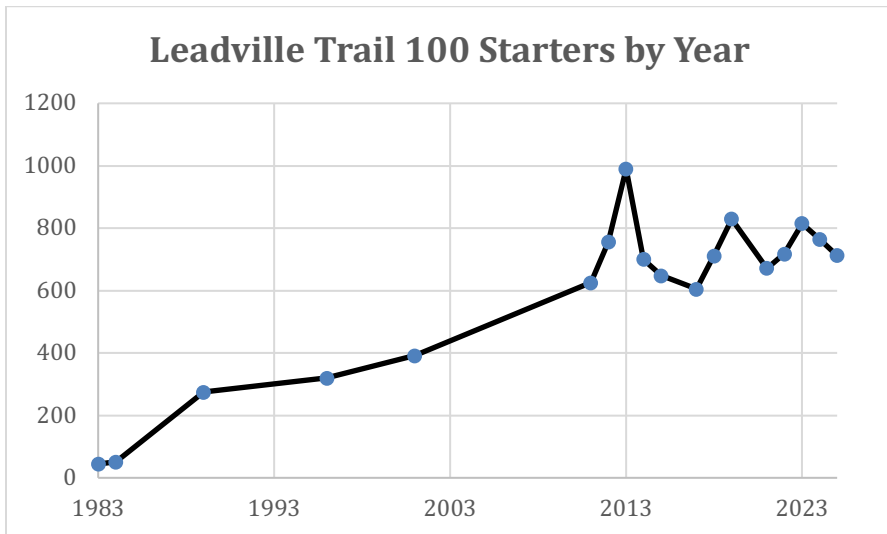
In 2025, the Leadville Trail 100 Mile Running race had 712 official starters and 381 total finishers (54% finishing percentage).

Males: 312 finishers/ 562 starters (56% finishing percentage)

Females: 69 finishers/ 147 starters (47% finishing percentage)

Compare that with 10 finishers at the first race in 1983 of 44, 45 or 46 starters, depending on what one has come to believe, haha. The number of official starters was actually 44, based on historical facts and other publications.

Here is the chart comparing those original starters with the number of runners standing at the starting line this year, 712 in 2025:



As one notices, there is a downward trend in the number of starters, the past two years.

While that decrease is good news, a reasonable target of 350 runners toeing the line at Leadville is something race management will probably never want to achieve.

The primary reasons for resisting a smaller starting field are these: Money, money and more money for Lifetime Fitness and their associates.

DreamChaser Rodrigo Jimenez finished with a time of 24:30:47/70th overall. Starting dead last, he passed 603 runners and raised over \$82,000 for the Leadville Trail 100 Legacy Foundation.

The Oldest Entrants:

- Oldest male finisher: Jeffrey Price age 67 in 27:52:22
- There were a total of 7 male runners in the 60-69 age group and no runners in the 70+ age group
- Oldest female finisher was Elizabeth Claflin age 57 in a time of 27:17:58
- There were no female runners over the age of 60

Final Finishing Results and Belt Buckle Statistics:

- 93 runners finished under 25 hours for the big buckle
 - 20 females
 - 73 males
- 381 total runners officially finished the race (out of 712 starters in the race). Finishing percentage was 54%
- Male: 312 finishers/562 starters (56% finishing percentage)
- Female: 69 finishers/147 starters (47% finishing percentage)
- Most DNF's: Catherine Greer - DNF 9-times in a row, including 2025 where she DNF'd at Half Pipe (Outbound) in 7:12:00. Laurel Meyers still holds the record with 10 DNF's in a row. Unfortunately, Laurel never finished the race but never lost hope before passing away.

Lead Challenge Race Series

Integral to the 100-mile running race is the Lead Challenge (previously called Leadman and Leadwoman races).

This challenge consists of 5 trail running and MTB events within the Leadville Race Series, covering 282.4 miles, all at 10,000+ feet of Rocky Mountain elevation.

This year's Lead Challenge saw a record number of finishers for the men.

- There were 7 women finishers and 36 men finishers in 2025

The 2025 Lead Challenge winners were Gabriel Martinez with a time of 40:07:49 and Maude Farrell with a time of 43:44:40.

The Leadman and Leadwoman course records (now called the Lead Challenge) are held by:

- Corey Kallembach 34:29:05 (2024) – Male
- Stephanie Wurtz 43:18:15 (2016) - Female

Allan Schmelzel, winner of the Last Ass award, was the final official finisher in a time of 29:57:38.

Eric Pence's 30-Time Finisher Report:

“The Leadville Trail 100 is a race that means so much to me. Going all the way back to 1991, I have been fortunate to start the race every year since. I think I have always looked at ultra running in the long term. It's what I love to do so it never becomes difficult to look forward to another race that interests me.

Reaching 30 finishes was a far-fetched dream. Bill Finkbeiner did it in 30 consecutive years with most of those finishing times pretty darn fast. He is someone I've admired for a long time.

I think the beauty of the Colorado high country is partially responsible for keeping me here as a resident and participant in the race. To me, it's easy to go out for a run on a mountain trail in the cool morning of summer or freezing cloudless sky in January. Before I know it, I'm ready to test myself over the rugged LT100 course.

I am just so thankful I've been able to stay healthy for so long and energized by this race. I can't say thank you loud enough to everyone involved in putting on this race. Of course, my family and friends have been there the entire way, especially Anne and Ethan.

The 30-year buckle is a beautiful piece of artistry and craftsmanship. Those craftsmen are so talented. I wear some of mine occasionally except the big one is going up on a wall!”

Race Observations/Changes

- In 2024, race management put a shuttle bus system in place⁶ along with new crew rules that failed in many ways. In 2025, parts of the shuttle bus system worked better specifically, Outward Bound to Twin Lakes. Wait times were reduced to 30 minutes.
- Twin Lakes Village crewing spaces were allocated via a lottery that made the chance of securing a place essentially zero, at best, for most crews it seemed. There were two lotteries for prized spaces one in May and another in July.
- Severe crewing problems occurred at May Queen Inbound. The problems were during ‘rush hour’ at approximately 2 am until 5 am when crews encountered parking problems with very long walks to the aid station.

The Crown Jewel of the Leadville Race Series still needs to regain its status as the ultimate high altitude 100 mile running race in North America. Life Time Fitness must make needed changes as outlined below.

Future Race Recommendations

- **Limit** LT100 running race size to 350 runners, maximum
- Plan crew parking for outlying areas and eliminate bus shuttles
- **Allow** crew access to **ALL** aid stations, including Winfield
- **Allow** pacers to begin at Winfield Inbound
- Have **TWO** Race Directors for the Leadville Race Series:
 - One Race Director for the Leadville Runs (A person with a Leadville Ultrarunning background)
 - One Race Director for the Leadville MTB Races (A person with a Leadville MTB racing background)

Miscellaneous Notes:

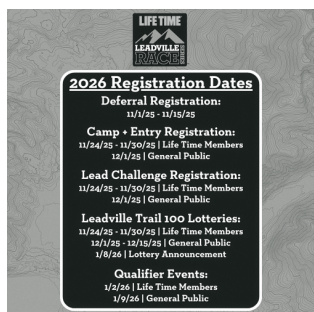
For the 2025, 42nd Edition of the race the official entry fee was \$450 via the limited lottery.

However, entries for the race are by controlled by these methods:

- Lottery (\$),
- Life Time Fitness Race Series Qualifiers (\$\$\$),
- Leadville Run Camp + Entry Package (\$\$\$),
- Coaching + Entry Packages (\$\$\$),
- Charity Slots (\$399 to \$199/monthly fee),
- Charity Slots (\$\$\$) and
- Life Time Member Guaranteed Entry (\$\$\$)

It should be noted that lottery slots are extremely limited with a methodology that has always been a complete mystery.

Many runners are relegated to purchasing other methods for gaining entry at considerable cost. If one fails to gain entry through the lottery expect to pay in excess of \$3,000 for one of the other entry options.



Here are the registration dates for the 2026 Leadville Trail 100:

There was a new service being offered at Leadville this year: Medical IV's for runners: "Swing by Leadville Outdoors at 225 Harrison today or tomorrow 11-7 to get race-ready with an IV packed full of vitamins and minerals! For a limited time enjoy a **free B12 shot** with any IV infusion — a \$30 value while supplies last!" Yeow!



Leadville's famous llamas atop Hope Pass were replaced this year by burros. Approximately 20 burros carried huge loads of supplies for weary runners. Thank you Lake County Search and Rescue for your efforts.

Leadville Trail 100 race founder, Jim Butera, was featured in a front-page article in the local Leadville Herald Democrat newspaper on December, 5, 2024 with a picture few have seen before.

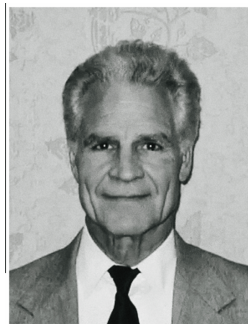


In the Footsteps of Legends Notes:

The Leadville family lost four great ones this year.

Harry Deupree – Twelve-time finisher (Best time 27:34:12):

Harry would always cross the finish line looking like he just stepped out of GQ Magazine: without a hair out of place and looking fresh. We still don't know how he did that. Harry and I (Steve) ran the very first Leadville 100 race together, in 1983, cresting Hope Pass twice before both of us became lost coming down from that brutal pass in the dark and missing the cutoff at Twin Lakes. Harry was always there to help when needed. Harry passed away at the age of 87 on June 14, 2025 in Mustang, Oklahoma.



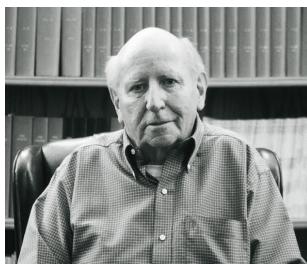
Elaine Stypula – 2011 Finisher (29:47:38): Elaine collapsed and died during the Hardrock 100-mile race in Silverton, Colorado on July 11, 2025 at age 60. She was an incredibly gifted and strong ultrarunner having run Comrades Ultramarathon, the Spartathlon, Bighorn Trail 100, Rocky Racoon 100 and so many other demanding ultra races.



Alex Pashley – 2013 (25:36:45): An ultrarunner/mountaineer from Steamboat Springs, Colorado. Alex, age 45, died in an avalanche in the Kootenay Mountains of British Columbia, Canada on March 24, 2025. Picture was taken at the Hardrock 100 in Colorado, 2023.



Carl Miller – August 9, 2025
Carl Miller was instrumental in helping Jim Butera secure permits that allowed the very first LT100 Run to happen in 1983. Carl was given the honor of firing the shotgun at that first starting line.
